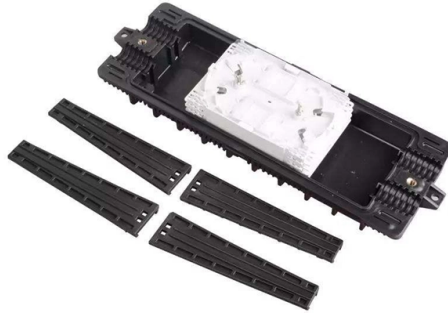


Spacing of horizontally laid cable trays



Overview

For horizontal sections where cable trays are laid out in a straight line, the typical support span (distance between supports) should range from 1. This range allows for easy access and efficient maintenance. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require. Cable tray (or cable ladder) systems are a popular alternative to electrical conduit systems, as they have an outstanding record for dependable service, design flexibility and cost savings in commercial and industrial applications. Although BS 7671 touches on the subject of cable supports, it does not detail specifically what these support distances should be.
