

What to do if the router's fiber optic cable is bent



Overview

The first step is to locate the source and extent of the damage. You can use a visual fault locator (VFL), which is a device that emits a red laser light through the fiber, to trace the cable and spot any breaks, cracks, or bends. That little sound conveys such a large message—it indicates your fiber optic cable has been bent beyond the manufacturer's specifications. During installation under tension, maintain a minimum bend radius of 20 times the cable's outer diameter, while post-installation requires a minimum long-term bend radius of 10 times the cable diameter. What. Despite their robustness, fiber networks can fail due to: Physical Damage : Cuts, bends, or contamination in fiber cables or connectors. Hardware Failures : Faulty transceivers, switches, or routers. Fiber optic cables should not be bent any tighter than ten times the diameter of the cable itself, preventing light from escaping the glass core (macro-bending loss).
